

## Darwin Hybrids Mix

The most beautiful tulips in a fantastic mixture: darwin hybrid tulips in their soft colours are known as long-flowering tulips on firm stems and are an asset in every garden. Darwin hybrids are single-flowered, mostly available in the colour palette yellow-pink-red-orange and are excellent for group planting. Planted at the right depth (about 15 cm), they can continue to flower for a number of years in succession.



# Triumph Mix

An eclectic mixture of the most beautiful triumph tulips. Because of the different months of flowering, this mixture will be flowering for a number of months in succession. Tulip mixtures can be planted by machine and will easily infuse colour in an embankment, roundabout or sports park in spring.

## Darwin Hybrid Tulips

Darwin Hybrid Tulips are all single-flowered cultivars with long-lasting flowers on strong stems. This type of tulip is very suitable for mass planting in a landscape setting or, with its height of 50-60 cm excellent as a cut flower. When planted at a depth of at least 15 cm, this group of tulips is performing well for several years. Mid-season flowering.



## Lily Flowering Tulips

This group of tulips is named for the shape of their blooms, which resemble old species tulips from Turkey. Their long, pointed petals arch outward and, when fully open, look like a six-point star. Most varieties are blooming late in the season and grow up to 50-60 cm and are not as sturdy as most other tulips. However their grace and elegance easily compensate this.

## Kaufmanniana Tulips

Kaufmanniana Tulips are, with some exceptions, generally low growing which make them ideal for rock gardens and containers. The flowers have pointed petals which open almost completely flat on sunny days. This type of tulip is also called waterlily tulip as a fully opened flower looks like a waterlily. The leaves are often striped or mottled. Early flowering and very suitable for naturalising.

## Greigii Tulips

Greigii Tulips originated from *Tulipa greigii* species which are native to Kazakhstan. Greigii Tulips have large flowers compared to the plants as a whole. The flowers come in very bright colours often with two-toned petals and open wide in full sun. Greigii Tulips are ideal for rock gardens and pots as they are very short. The distinctive foliage is mottled with maroon stripes.

## Parrot Tulips

These tulips were developed from mutations of certain late flowering and Triumph Tulips. The flowers are large and have deeply feathered, curled or twisted brightly coloured petals. Parrot Tulips are somewhat sensitive to cold and wet weather so they require a somewhat protected spot. Flowering season is mid to late. They make excellent cut flowers.

# More colour and biodiversity in the living environment

In addition to supplying and planting flower bulbs, we want to broaden our horizon.

In collaboration with Griffioen Wassenaar, we offer colourful, low-weed perennials for public green spaces, but also for projects such as offices and parking areas.

The great variation and the long flowering season mean that perennials make a major contribution to the biodiversity in the living environment. Perennials attract many different butterflies, bees and insects.



The perennials are sustainably grown in low-peat substrates, in an extra heavy pot size (P11) for a large root ball. The application of eight plants per square meter ensures rapid dense growth. As a result, weed growth has less chance and maintenance is manageable.

Because the costs of management and maintenance are considered, we work with specifically selected strong types of perennials.

Before planting, the soil is improved with a special substrate that adds a good amount of long-acting organic fertiliser to the soil. This ensures a better structure of the soil.



Every year after the winter, at the right time according to the carefully composed care plan, the perennials are mowed, fertilised and mulched in one go with a mulching machine. This annual treatment ensures an environmentally friendly way of feeding and rejuvenates the crop, which also ensures a long lifetime.
